

Jack Dauner Receives French Legion of Honor Award

On June 1, Jack Dauner received France's highest tribute, the French Legion of Honor. This award is bestowed upon both French citizens and foreign nationals who have demonstrated meritorious service to France, in either a civil or military capacity. Jack served in World War II with the United States Army from 1943 through 1946. On November 1, 1944, Jack landed in Normandy and was sent to the front lines. As a WWII veteran, Jack is one of

approximately 240,000 United States soldiers remaining from the Greatest Generation. The United States government has recognized Jack with multiple awards and honors for his military service. And on June 1, the country of France also honored Jack. Mr. Vincent Hommeril is the French Consul General overseeing the relationship between France and the Southeast United States. Mr. Hommeril traveled from Atlanta, where he

is based, to present this award to Jack at a service held at Community Congregational Church. He thanked Jack for his participation in a war fought nearly eight decades ago. He said, "Mr. Dauner, you embody the shared French American history; you are a true hero. Your example gives us inspiration for the future. And your legacy provides a moral compass for generations to come."

Prayer Shawls

As many of you know, the Prayer Shawl knitting group meets monthly to create shawls that are passed along to Hospice House in Pinehurst for their patients. To date over 585 shawls have been lovingly created and passed along.

Recently a new photograph appeared on the Church bulletin board. It was a picture of Joan Smith and a Shawl featuring the colors of the Ukrainian flag. When asked about this, Joan tells the following story:



"I was trying to think of a pattern for my 180th shawl. Because of the horrible problems in Ukraine, the flag of Ukraine is pictured frequently in the news and I thought I would make my shawl representative of this time in my personal history. I keep a scrapbook of all of the shawls I've made with the dates I've finished them.

"I spoke with Lois Vollmer, who heads up our knitters group, and told her what I was doing, but we wondered how would we find an appropriate recipient, someone of Ukrainian heritage. Well, as luck would have it, or maybe it was the hand of God...I go to a local naturopath/chiropractor every month. I take my knitting with me because

there's usually a wait and I can knit maybe 10 to 12 rows before it's my turn. The two girls who work in the doctor's office like to see what I'm working on every month and I told them my story.

They surprised me when they said, 'We have a Ukrainian patient in our practice! She's a young woman but has an 88 year old grandmother who won't leave her country to join other family members who have come here.' The office gals contacted their patient, Alisa, and asked if she would be interested in having a shawl that represented her country's flag. If so, she could contact me, and they gave her my email address. The next day she did contact me and we arranged a day and time for me to pass the finished shawl along to her. The girls in the office took a photo of the exchange.



Alisa will keep the shawl and enjoy it until the time comes when it will be safe to send it to her grandmother. "Right now nothing is getting through to anyone in the mail."

"So that's the story! I designed the shawl so that when it's around the person's shoulders, the blue color is over the gold. And the light gray is smoke from the war. I do feel that God did have a hand in this."






