Pastor's Message

As the newsletter deadline approached, we lost one of the true characters of our church family. Eli Jaksic passed away at the age of 98 years old.

Many of you will remember Eli as The Candy Man! He loved the ministry of passing out candy before church. He continued that practice at Southern Pines Gracious Living, where he lived for the past several years. I once asked him why he loved handing out the candy, and his response will warm your heart. He said, "I like to see people smile, and maybe, just for a minute or two, they will forget about their problems!"

He also always had a joke! It was not uncommon to pass Eli in the hallway of the church, and he would say, "Got a joke for you!" His own laugh at the conclusion of the joke was better than the joke itself!

Eli would oftentimes hand me a piece of paper before church with a joke written on it, and he would say, "This one you can use in church!" Sometimes I did that, and as a tribute to a great man, here is one of the jokes he gave me:

From Your Stewardship Committee

If you have an Individual Retirement Account (IRA) and are age 70 ¹/₂ or greater, you know that you must make Required Minimum Distributions (RMDs) each calendar year. While your contributions to your IRA were made with pre-tax dollars, distributions are fully taxable at your current tax rate if you take them in cash. The exception to that is if you make a distribution to a charity or other 501-c3 organization such as our church. Those are Non-Taxable up to a limit of \$100,000 per year. So this could be an efficient way to take care of all or part of your annual pledge to our church. In 1895, a group of devoted Christians consisting of local businessmen and winter visitors from New England formed the First Congregational Church in Southern Pines.


In 1967 the church was renamed Community Congregational Church in order to reflect its commitment to being a church open to all, hence we are known as "The Church of Wide Fellowship."

in Lent and is about to begin rehearsing for Palm Sunday, Maundy Thursday and Easter. On Palm Sunday, in addition to our anthem, we will be treated to a piano solo version of The Palms. This Easter, we will have two joyous musical selections along with vocal and brass soloists to celebrate Jesus' resurrection in song. Both before and after Easter, soloists from our choir will share their talents during our services.

I'm delighted to say that our choir has been invited to join three other area choirs in the presentation of a major musical work. Brownson Memorial Presbyterian Church in Southern Pines has asked us, as well as Southern Pines United Methodist and Culdee Presbyterian in West End, to sing **the exquisite Requiem of Gabriel Fauré** with them and guest soprano and baritone soloists, accompanied by orchestra. The concert will be on **Sunday, May 21st at 7:00**. The work is about 40 minutes long and was completed in 1890. It represents very clearly the composer's strong faith in eternal rest and has a sense of consolation throughout. It would be great to see a contingent of Community Congregational folks at the concert to hear our choir be part of about 60 singers performing this beautiful piece!

A number of you have asked me to let you know when I have concerts of my own coming up. Here are a couple of events in May and June with which I'm involved. I would love for you to come!

- Thursday, May 25th at 6:00 at Midland Country Club, as part of Table on the Green's monthly Music Night, soprano Alina Cherkasova, my husband, baritone Bob Mobsby, whom most of you know, and I, accompanied on piano by Anastasia Bryant, will be presenting **favorite operatic arias, duets and trios** - including the ones to which you know the tunes but maybe not the names. This includes a buffet dinner.

- Friday, June 2nd at 7:00 - at Brownson Presbyterian, an evening of glorious chamber music of **Brahms**. Performers will include pianists David Jesse and Christopher Tavernier, tenor Aaron Carlyle and, once again, Alina, Bob and me. Repertoire will include solo piano works and four-hand piano works, as well as solo songs (and I will sing my favorite song ever written, a setting of the 1st Corinthians text about love), duets, and the first set of the beloved Liebeslieder Walzer (Love Song Waltzes) for vocal quartet and two pianists.

Curry Chicken Salad

Ingredients:

- 2 cups cooked chicken, chopped
- 1 can (5 oz.) water chestnuts, diced
- 1/2 lb. seedless grapes (green or red), halved
- 1/2 cup chopped celery
- 1 cup honey dew melon balls, (optional)

Instructions:

- 1. In a large bowl, combine chicken, water chestnuts, grapes & celery.
- 2. In a small bowl, mix mayonnaise with lemon juice, soy sauce, curry powder, salt & pepper.
- 3. Combine with chicken mixture.
- 4. Serve in lettuce cups, placing melon balls around salad (optional).

Dressing:

- 1 cup mayonnaise
- 1 tsp. soy sauce
- 1/2 tsp. curry powder
- 1 Tbl. lemon juice
- 1/4 tsp. salt
- 1/2 tsp. pepper






~ One of my favorite recipes! Elaine Portman ~


